Trial recruits 100th patient

A pancreatic cancer trial that aims to match patients with more targeted and effective treatments for their tumours has recruited its 100th patient.

The scheme is run by Precision-Panc, a research programme and clinical trials project led by Glasgow University with funding from Cancer Research UK.

Under the project, each patient has a tumour biopsy, with the material then used for molecular profiling at the Glasgow Precision Oncology Laboratory at the university. The results can be used to help match patients to the most suitable treatment or clinical trial.

The project's success over the last year has seen it rolled out to 16 sites around the UK, the university said.
